This program will be an inclusive two-year non degree Certificate program with an additional two-year non degree Advanced Certificate option. This program is for students with moderate Intellectual or Developmental Disabilities and will provide more support than the RiverHawks Scholar Program.





MEDICARE SAVINGS PRORAM Helps cover Medicare premiums

- May help pay for your hospital benefits & doctor visits
- May reduce or eliminate copay & or deductibles

Lifespan Respite Grant Voucher Program

Eligibility for caregiver:

- Is 18 or older, full-time, unpaid
- Is a grandparent or other relative age 54 or younger raising a child
- No more than \$90,000 of annual household income
- Does not receive respite services or payments from other programs including, but not limited to foster care, Family Support Assistance Payment, OAA Title III-E, ODMHSAS Systems of Care funding, or a DHS Child Care Subsidy.

If the Care Receiver is an Oklahoma resident

Age birth to 59 who needs help with activities of daily living (ADL) who has

- Cognitive Impairment/Dementia
- Intellectual Disabilities
- Developmental Disabilities
- Mental Health/Behavioral Issues
- Physical Disabilities
- Traumatic Brain Injury
- Other special health care needs

Does not qualify for respite services or payments through any other program including, but not limited to, DHS Developmental Disability Services, SSI-DCP, OAA Title III-E, ADvantage waiver program, Medicare-funded home health services or hospice.

Educational Vouchers

Educational vouchers help caregivers pay for care of their loved ones so they can attend training that assists with their caregiving.


- \$50 for half day training or \$100 for a full day training event per eligible caregiver.
- Must complete an application prior to the educational event
- Must be registered for the educational event

Emergency Vouchers

Emergency voucher is a one time, \$250, voucher issued on a case-by-case basis for full-time, unpaid caregivers that have an unexpected need for support in caring for their loved one due to surgery or unexpected hospitalization, death in the family or any other unexplained situation

COVID-19 adjustments through June 30, 2020

- Increase the current voucher amount from \$300 to \$400 every 90 days;
- Care providers must be age 18 or older and have a social security number and card plus the care provider can live with the caregiver and care receiver; and
- Lift the household income restriction of \$90K to no household income.

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The Oklahoma Family Network connects families who have children with special health care needs, disabilities or behavioral health concerns to other families, services and supports in their community.



- Emotional Support: connections to a support parent, support group or private online support group
- Information and Training: connections to resources and training to assist in navigating services and supports
- Advocacy and Leadership: connections to leadership development and opportunities to partner with other agencies and organizations who provide services and supports

ADvantage Waiver eligibility requirements

To be eligible for the ADvantage waiver program, a person must:

- Must qualify financially for SoonerCare
- Be 65 years of age or over, or 21-64 and disabled
- Be determined to meet the Nursing Facility institutional level of care by nursing staff of Aging Services Division.
- Not have a primary diagnosis of developmental disabilities.
- Be a legal resident of the state of Oklahoma.

- Older Americans Act Title III
- Provides funding to enable local agencies to provide services for eligible seniors
- Eligibility includes people 60+ who do not receive ADvantage services
- Eligibility for Grandparents raising Grandchildren is 55+
- An assessment is required before services are provided

Possible services include:

- Meals Nutrition Counseling, Congregate meals, Home Delivered Meals
- Transportation Medical, Personal, and Caregiver rides
- In Home Services Personal Care, Homemaker, Chore/Repair
- Caregiver Respite, Support Groups, Education
- Other services Legal Assistance, Health Classes, Information Assistance and Coordination
